L: O Spirit of the First Song, the Origins of a Lullaby, we come here today with our burdens in tow.

A: Would you grant us a comfort, O Gentle Jesus? Our pain has no place to land, no cradle for our sorrows to rock in.

L: And say to us: Yes, let it out. I've got you now. There, there, dear child, there, there.
